# ELECTRONIC COUNTING MACHINE

Testing of an electronic counting machine is currently on-going. This is a joint project with RRFB Nova Scotia. We expect that this counting machine will add significant accuracy and increase the capacity (volume) of containers going to quality control on a daily basis. This electronic counting machine was designed and developed in NB for a fraction of the price of similar type machines used in our industry.

# MARKET RELIEF

This year markets briefly rebounded to pre-2008 levels and even beyond, particularly on the PET. This was welcomed news for the entire industry.

As of March 31st, Encorp Atlantic recovered 157 million beverage containers for an annualized recycle rate of 70%. This rate which is substantially lower than previous years is directly related to the count adjustment model with RCs.

Since the introduction of this program, RCs in New Brunswick have become one of the most accurate network of recycling depots in the country with an accuracy rate of -0.4%. Plus, once adjustments are made to RCs that are over the ±2% range, the overall accuracy rate goes to an amazing perfect score of 0%. This compares to the - 7% range prior to the introduction of this new program.
