NOTICE TO ALL NEW BRUNSWICK REDEMPTION CENTRES

Encorp Atlantic Will Recycle All Single-Use Plastic Bags in New Brunswick Redemption Centres. CUSTOMERS' DISCARDED PLASTIC BAGS ACCEPTED IN ENCORP BULK BAGS.



- New Brunswickers bring used beverage containers to redemption centres for recycling in plastic bags.
- Containers are sorted by type and put in bulk bags to be recycled. Discarded plastic bags are also put in large bulk bags for recycling.
- Plastic bags are transformed into plastic pellets.
- Plastic pellets are used to make new bags and other products.

Starting June 2, 2019, Encorp Atlantic will collect and recycle all plastic bags used by New Brunwickers to bring empty beverage containers to redemption centres (RCs) in communities across the province.

Encorp Atlantic's slow-moving trucks will pick up the discarded plastic bags – of all types and colours - accumulated in RCs at the same time as they do their regular pick ups.

The new plastic bag recycling policy fits in with Encorp Atlantic's ongoing efforts to help modernize New Brunswick's Beverage Containers Program, reduce its environmental footprint, and increase recycling in communities across the province.

WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR CUSTOMERS' PLASTIC BAGS:

- 1 Tell your customers that plastic bags collected at your redemption centre will gladly be recycled.
- 2 Put the discarded plastic bags in Encorp regular bulk bags. Fill bulk bags containing discarded plastic bags to no more than 60 lbs (27 kg).
- 3 Bulk bags containing discarded plastic bags will be collected every week by Encorp's slow moving trucks.

Note: For this new initiative to be successful, only discarded single-use plastic bags will be accepted.

- Plastic bags must be non-contaminated (no liquids left in bags).
- No bottle caps, straws and other garbage.
- No paper.
- No ties.
