

Is It Deposit-Bearing?

Please take note of the following beverage products for which we receive many inquiries.



Tim Hortons - Icedcapp

<u>Iced coffee drinks are deposit-bearing</u> since April 1, 2020.



Icee Slush

This is in a ready-to-drink form - similar to other juices in pouches even though it is frozen. Such beverages are deposit-bearing.



Fruit of the Earth Aloe Vera Juice

This is in a ready-to-drink form.

Says on the label it does not need to be diluted – though it can be. Qualifies thus as a "beverage" and is deposit-bearing.



Starbucks Cold Brew Coffee Concentrate

Concentrates (need to be diluted or mixed prior to drinking) are excluded from the program. No deposit.



Tazo Chai Latte Black Tea Concentrate

Concentrates (need to be diluted or mixed prior to drinking) are excluded from the program. No deposit.



Baileys Coffee Creamer

Similar to concentrates, creamers are excluded from the program. No deposit.
