|  |  <p>Activia Shot Probiotic Drink</p> <p>This is a drinkable yogurt drink. Drinkable yogurt (and other beverages with dairy) are deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020.</p> |  <p>Eggnog</p> <p>Eggnog is deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020. We have been made aware that some eggnog products do not have the appropriate “<i>Return for Refund</i>” message on their label; however, you must still refund your customers for all eggnog beverages.</p> |  <p>Kirkland – Nutrition Shake</p> <p>Sports drinks and nutritional supplements <u>not</u> labelled as a “Meal Replacement” or a “Formulated Liquid Diet” are included in the program. This beverage is thus <u>deposit-bearing</u>.</p> |
|  |  <p>Liberté Goat Milk</p> <p>Milk (cow and goat) is excluded from the program. Therefore, this beverage is <u>NOT</u> deposit-bearing.</p> |  <p>Milk 2 Go 1% - Vanilla</p> <p>The label says <i>Partly Skimmed Milk</i> right on the front of the container.</p> <p>This beverage is <u>real milk</u> with an added flavour. Milk is excluded from the program. Therefore, this beverage is <u>NOT</u> deposit-bearing.</p> |  <p>Milk on the Moove 1%-Strawberry</p> <p>The label says <i>Partly Skimmed Milk</i> right on the front of the container.</p> <p>This beverage is <u>real milk</u> with an added flavour. Milk is excluded from the program. Therefore, this beverage is <u>NOT</u> deposit-bearing.</p> |
