








Is It Deposit-Bearing?

Please take note of the following beverage products for which we receive many inquiries.

	 <p>Real Shake (Milk Shake)</p> <p>“Milk shake” means made with milk/contains milk. Milk shakes and many other beverages with dairy are deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020.</p>	 <p>Silk Cashew</p> <p>Plant-based beverages like this one, which are labelled as “Fortified” AND ALSO have the “Not a source of protein” warning on their label, are deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020.</p>	 <p>PediaSure Complete Grow & Gain</p> <p>To be excluded from the Beverage Containers Program, diet/nutrition type drinks must be labelled specifically either as a “Meal Replacement” or a “Formulated Liquid Diet”. This product is NOT labelled as a “Meal Replacement” or a “Formulated Liquid Diet”. Therefore, it is deposit-bearing.</p>
	 <p>Baxter Milk (1%, 2%, 3.25%)</p> <p>Real milk is excluded from the Beverage Containers Program. No deposit.</p>	 <p>Silk Protein Almond & Cashew</p> <p>This plant-based beverage is labelled as “Fortified” and considered a source of protein. (There is no “Not a source of protein” warning on the label, which means there is protein in the beverage. In fact, as its name suggests, the product even advertises a high protein content!)</p> <p>Since this plant-based beverage is fortified and a source of protein, it is excluded from the Beverage Containers Program. No deposit.</p>	 <p>Carnation Breakfast Essentials Meal Replacement</p> <p>Diet/nutrition type drinks that are not required to have a deposit must be labelled specifically either as a “Meal Replacement” or a “Formulated Liquid Diet”. Label indicates this is a “Meal Replacement”.</p> <p>Excluded from the Beverage Containers Program. No deposit.</p>
