

Is It Deposit-Bearing?

Please take note of the following beverage products for which we receive many inquiries.

	 <p>Nestlé Nesquik Chocolate Flavoured Milk Beverage</p> <p>Beverages with dairy like this one are deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020. The beverage is made with milk/contains milk, <u>but it is not real milk/labelled as milk</u> (if it were, there would be the words <i>skim milk</i>, <i>partly skimmed milk 1%</i> or <i>2%</i> or <i>whole milk 3.25%</i> on the label).</p>	 <p>iögo Nano Drinkable Yogurt (all types, all flavours)</p> <p>Drinkable yogurt and other beverages with dairy are deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020.</p>	 <p>Starbucks Coffee Beverages (all types, all flavours)</p> <p>Coffee drinks which contain milk, like other beverages made with dairy, are deposit-bearing since April 1, 2020.</p>
	 <p>NatreL Lactose Free Fine Filtered Milk (all types, all flavours)</p> <p>It says <i>Ultra-Filtered Skim</i> and <i>Partly Skimmed Milk</i> right on the front of these containers. This is <u>real milk</u> even though it is lactose free and in one of these examples, it has a chocolate flavour. Real milk is excluded from the program. No deposit is charged.</p>	 <p>Cow's Milk (all brands, including for example Baxter and Northumberland)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ultra-Filtered • Low-Fat/Skim • Partly Skimmed (1%, 2%) • Whole/Homogenized (3.25%) <p>Cow's milk is considered an essential nutritional product and thus excluded from the program. No deposit is charged. (Note: This also applies to cow and goat milk with added flavours like chocolate, strawberry, banana, etc.)</p>	 <p>Starbucks Cold Brew Coffee Concentrate</p> <p><u>Concentrates (need to be diluted or mixed prior to drinking) are excluded from the program.</u> No deposit.</p>
